Cats and Colours

Recently I was asked what colours the cats could enjoy. That is an excellent question, because of course colours have an impact on the behaviour of cats. By anthropomorphism, one would think that cats or other animals perceive colour as we do, of course it would be a mistake. Colour perception is present through the cones in the retina, and which are sensitive to blue, green or yellow.

Without having to repaint your apartment coloured spots placed at appropriate locations can be enough to help your cat. Cushions, baskets, blankets, for example.

Studies have shown that the retina of a cat is more receptive to indigo shades of blue and green.

Like most animals and humans, red is a colour that enhances aggressiveness: place 2 cats that do not support each other in a red room and a fight is guaranteed.

Violet and purple will allow anxious cats to calm down, there are also colours that reassure cats at the end of their life, or cats who have suffered a big psychological

shock: a cat attacked by a dog, for example, or a cat who has been the victim of an accident will recover faster in a room where purple is the dominant colour. Similarly orange and yellow shades boost the immune system. To be used without moderation for colds or contagious diseases, but also if kitty loses appetite, orange makes you hungry! Yellows would also be able to stimulate older cats who have no desire to

able to stimulate older cats who have no desire to play. They make you want to move and do more physical activities.

What about green? The colour of plants, it would stimulate the action of homeopathic and herbal treatments. Its soothing properties are similar to those of blue, but would also be conducive to sleeping.

Blue and shades of blue are essential during hot weather, they would regulate the cat's body temperature.

Blues are defined as cold colours.

It would seem that an animal who had a heat stroke is recovering more easily with moistened blue towels. It is also the anti fights between cats colour, soothing, relaxing, ideal for calming a nervous cat or to defuse conflict.

Of course, colours are not everything, and like humans, kitty may have different preferences than Felix. These are generalities and in no case more!

A visit to the vet is indispensable if your cat is sick, and appropriate therapy is also inevitable when things are serious. It is clear that if Felix and kitty fight every time they meet, blue nor green will change anything.

This is only a gentle and natural way to promote a harmonious environment for your favourite cat.

A bit of news from our counterparts in France

A Wonderful Blue Day

AICR (International Association of the Russian Cat), the French RUS breed club had its RUS Special on 8 February.

(In France, there is only one breed: RUS which includes the 4 varieties: Russian Blue, Russian Black, Russian White and Nebelung.)

We were all a bit anxious as 20 RUS was the minimum number of cats required for this Special.

32 RUS (16 RB and 16 NEB) were present. A record! There has never been a cat show with that many RUS since the breed was introduced in France. Sadly there was no Russian Black or White. Those 2 varieties are even more confidential in France than the other 2.

There were several breeders as well as pet owners for whom as well as their kittens it was the very first time to go to a show. A NEB breeder came from Portugal especially for the occasion. He flew with his queen and her 4 month old kitten. We also had several club members (pet owners) who came (cat less) just to spend the day with us, travelling great distances for some.

The whole day was a blast. Time flew at light speed. Everybody was simply so happy to be together, to meet, to chat, to admire the RUS beauties present as well as those left at home (there was a lot of pictures showing on mobile phones).

The public was there too, eager to talk to exhibitors and asking questions about the breed. 2 699 visitors were recorded.

The RUS were judged by All Breed judge Daniel Counasse (BE), a connoisseur and lover of the breed. His judging was very interesting to follow as he detailed each cat and when some were competing for the same title, he explained his choice. (Judging in France is "public")

During his judging, he selected 9 RUS which he deemed best.

His selection would be announced later in the afternoon on the podium. However, after his judging was finished, Best Varieties were called onto the podium. The owners went to the podium with their cat and received a rosette as well as a present. Then a full breed presentation was also done by the Club's President on the podium with several cats, explaining everything to the public who was all ears.

Then came THE moment everyone had been waiting for: the 9 RUS cat numbers were called on the podium. The judge of the Special explained a few things to the public and then proceeded with the Special. He of course started in reverse order.
